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ARBA 2021 NATIONAL YOUTH T-SHIRT DESIGN CONTEST

PURPOSE

Each year T-shirts are provided all Royalty and Individual Contest contestants at the annual ARBA Convention. These shirts are unique and highly sought after memorabilia. Part of the uniqueness is that the artwork imprinted has been provided by an ARBA youth.

RULES

- 1. All artwork must be suitable for a front design of a T-shirt.
- 2. Two categories of designs are needed (1) youth participant and (2) youth contest volunteer.
- 3. All artwork must be original signed works submitted on white paper sized 8.5x11 up to 11x14 inches. Computer generated artwork may be submitted on storage media with the hard copy of the submitted work.
- 4. Pencil drawings, line drawings, grayscale sketches, etc. will be accepted, either hand or computer generated. No photographic artwork!
- 5. Artwork must include: a rabbit and a cavy; the organizational name "ARBA" or "American Rabbit Breeders Association"; the theme of this year's convention "WIN BY A HARE IN 2021"; the location and dates of the convention "Louisville, KY October 23-27, 2021". If the artwork is for category 2, contest volunteer, the artwork must also include: "Volunteer".
- 6. Winners will be announced at the Youth Banquet at the National Convention. Contestants need not be present to win.
- 7. All artwork submitted becomes the property of the ARBA Youth Committee and will not be returned. Entries must include your name, address, age, phone number, and ARBA member number on the backside of Artwork.

ENTRY PROCEDURES

Entries should be mailed to the ARBA Youth Chairperson and must be postmarked by July 1, 2021. Postal or electronic mail submissions will be accepted for this contest.







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ARBA 2021 NATIONAL YOUTH INDIVIDUAL CONTESTS

PURPOSE

To acknowledge excellence among ARBA youth members in attendance at the ARBA National Convention and Show through the evaluation of their knowledge and skills involved in the rabbit and cavy industry.

RULES

- 1 Any ARBA youth member is eligible to compete, however, attendance at the National Convention is required.
- 2 A contestant may enter as many contests that are age-appropriate as they wish.
- 3 The age of a contestant is determined as of the last day of the national convention.
- 4 All contestants must check in, either personally or by an adult representative, by 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, October 23, 2021. Contestants will be given approximate times for their contest participation at check-in.

CONTESTS AND DIVISIONS

National Breed Identification Contest

- 1 Divisions: Junior (Ages 5 to 11 years), Intermediate (Ages 12 to 14 years), and Senior (Ages 15 -18 years).
- 2 Contestants will identify 25 animals, both rabbits and cavies, listing the complete breed name as printed in the *ARBA Standard of Perfection*, the showroom variety, whether a 4-class or 6-class breed, and the registration variety of each of the 25 animals.
- 3 No abbreviations are accepted.

National Skill-a-Thon Contest

- 1 Division: Pre-Junior (Ages 5 to 8 years).
- 2 Preregistration is encouraged, but not required for this contest.
- 3 Contestants will participate in various knowledge and skills stations.

National Showmanship Contest

- 1 Division: Junior (Ages 9 to 11 years).
- 2 Contestants will examine and evaluate an animal telling what and why as they go along.
- 3 A contestant may use their own animal or the committee will have some available the first round.
- 4 Call backs will be made for at least the top five at each table. Call backs will be posted by noon Sunday.

National Judging Contest

- 1 Divisions: Intermediate (Ages 12 to 14 years), and Senior (Ages 15 -18 years).
- 2 Each team member will be required to place four classes of four animals per class. This is a timed event of 7 minutes per class. The use of the ARBA Standard of Perfection at the judging table is encouraged.
- 3 Judging classes may involve rabbits (including meat classes), cavies, fur and wool.

4 Call backs will be made for at least the top five at each table. Call backs will be posted by noon Sunday. Those contestants who receive a judging call back will be required to give oral reasons on one class of the call back judging animals. Please see the ARBA Youth Committee notes page (https://www.arba.net/arbayouth/) for updates. Also, rough handling of animals during call backs will receive a penalty of up to 20 points, depending upon the severity of infraction.

ENTRY PROCEDURES

Entry must be made **online** or on the form provided by the ARBA Youth Department. This form is available from your ARBA District Director, the ARBA office, the ARBA Youth Website, and the ARBA Youth Committee. **NO EMAIL ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.**

All online entries, including the uploading of completed forms must be completed by 11:59:59 p.m. Eastern Daylight Time on September 1, 2021. Mailed entries must be postmarked by August 20, 2021 and should be mailed to the ARBA Youth Chairperson.

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ARBA 2021 NATIONAL YOUTH EDUCATIONAL CONTESTS

PURPOSE

To acknowledge excellence among ARBA youth members who create exhibits that show some aspect of the rabbit or cavy industry. These exhibits must be placed on view at the annual ARBA National Convention.

RULES

- 1 Any ARBA youth member is eligible to compete. Attendance at the National Convention is not necessary.
- 2 Exhibits must be informational or promotional of either rabbits or cavies, or include a rabbit or cavy as part of their design.
- 3 A contestant may enter as many classes as they choose, but may submit only one entry per class.
- 4 Each entry must be the work of the contestant and must have been completed in the 12 months prior to the ARBA National Convention. Whenever possible, label exhibits on the back or bottom with exhibitor name, state and district.
- 5 All articles must be displayed in the designated area at the National Convention.
- 6 All entries will receive ribbons (Blue=excellent, Red=very good, White=good). Top entries in each class will be reevaluated to determine the National winners. National winners will be announced at the Youth Banquet at the National Convention. Exhibitors need not be present to win.
- 7 If an exhibitor is unable to attend the National Convention, transportation of their entry to the convention site will be their responsibility. If necessary, exhibits may be shipped directly to the ARBA Convention site but only after contact with the ARBA Youth Department chairperson. [Because of the nature of large convention sites, special addressing and labeling along with specific delivery dates are required.]
- 8 Your name, address, age, and class entered should be clearly indicated on both the inside and outside of the entry and any packaging. Be sure your exhibit comes with instructions as to the disposition of your exhibit at the end of the Convention. An attempt will be made to return any unclaimed exhibits through your ARBA District Director. Otherwise unclaimed exhibits will be destroyed at the end of the convention.

DIVISIONS

Exhibitors will enter the class listed below, and based upon age, exhibit in one of three age divisions for EACH CLASS. For example, there will be three Art – Drawing classes (Junior, Intermediate, Senior) that will each have a Best of Class awarded. These three class winners, along with the three class winners EACH in Art – Painting and Art - Sculpture or Carving will compete for National Winner in the Art Group.



Art Division

Framing, with or without glass, and /or an easel to display is optional.

Drawing Painting Sculpture or Carving

Crafts Division

Display to best suit the item and clearly and easily visible. Small items may be fastened to a display board or in a display box for protection.

Ceramics or Pottery Handmade Jewelry Clothing (made by exhibitor) Needlework Puppet or Stuffed Animal Stenciled Item Wearable Art Any Other Craft

Creative Writing Division

Exhibit in a protective report cover or clear plastic sleeve for protection. Exhibited at convention. Do not send to Youth Committee Chair prior to convention.

Poem

Short Story

Educational Division

Display

Mounted on a self-supporting display board with items arranged for viewing in front. The display board should provide information regarding the item(s) on display.

Game

Poster

Overall size should be 22"x28" mounted on a stiff backing.

Photography Division

Photos no smaller than 4" x 6" or larger than 11" x 14", printed horizontally or vertically, mounted for display.

Framing, with or without glass, and /or an easel to display is optional.

Single Photo – Black & White Single Photo – Color Photo Series

Three to six pictures mounted together to tell a story or convey an idea.

Rabbit or Cavy Equipment

ENTRY PROCEDURES

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ARBA 2021 NATIONAL YOUTH ACHIEVEMENT CONTEST

PURPOSE

To acknowledge outstanding achievement and leadership by ARBA youth members in the rabbit and/or cavy industry, as measured by activities and leadership in organizations and associations, performance at the show table, achievements in breeding and raising animals and the vision and goals set for themselves and their project.

RULES

- 1 Any ARBA youth member is eligible to compete. Membership must be valid on September 1st. Attendance at the ARBA National Convention is not necessary.
- 2 Applications are to be composed and completed by the contestant.
- 3 Up to seven pages and less than 4500 words, printed on one side only, may be submitted by the applicant.
- 4 Include your name and ARBA membership number at the top of each page of information submitted.
- 5 If entering online, you may upload you application. If entering by mail, you must send your Contest Entry Form and **ONE** copy of your answers!

CATEGORIES

Applications will be judged by ARBA District and contestant age (division). Divisions are: Junior (Ages 5 to 11 years), Intermediate (Ages 12 to 14 years), and Senior (Ages 15 -18 years). Age is determined by the contestant's age on the last day of the National Convention. Winners will be announced at the Youth Banquet at the ARBA National Convention. Contestants need not be present to win.

SCORING CRITERIA

Applications will be judged on the following criteria: Achievement (60 points); Leadership (50 points); Goals & Plans for the Future (40 points); Clarity & Thoroughness of Answers (30 points); Neatness & Appearance of Application (20 points). Applications that do not follow the rules listed above will be assessed a penalty of 10 points per infraction, with the exception of late applications which will be assessed a penalty of 20 points for up to one week late and disqualification for later than one week.

ENTRY PROCEDURES

Entry must be made **online** or on the form provided by the ARBA Youth Department. This form is available from your ARBA District Director, the ARBA office, the ARBA Youth Website, and the ARBA Youth Committee. **NO EMAIL ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.**

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ARBA NATIONAL YOUTH ACHIEVEMENT CONTEST APPLICATION

QUESTIONS

- 1 When did you join the ARBA and how many consecutive years have you belonged?
- 2 Which rabbit or cavy organizations are you a member of (use full names)?
- 3 List any office or committee positions that you have held in a rabbit or cavy organization.
- 4 Describe any rabbit or cavy activities that you participated in and/or developed.
- 5 Explain what you do to make others aware of rabbits or cavies.
- 6 List the things you have done to encourage others to join rabbit or cavy organizations.
- 7 Explain how you have helped others learn new skills and increased their knowledge of this hobby.
- 8 Make a list of any awards you have won individually or as a member of a group in the last 3 years. (1st place Breed ID, Washington Co., Missouri Rabbit Prince, etc.)
- 9 Choose 2 or 3 of the most important award(s) you have won individually or as a member of a group within your project. Explain why those awards are important to you and what winning them taught you.
- 10 Make a table of your animal wins for the last 3 years. (# of BOB, # of BOS, etc.)
- 11 Choose 2 or 3 of the most important award(s) you have won with your animals. Explain why those awards are important to you and what winning them taught you.
- 12 What goals have you achieved to this point in your project?
- 13 What goals have you set for yourself with regards to your rabbit or cavy project?
- 14 Explain how the achievement of these goals will help you in the future?
- 15 What would you like us to know that has not been asked?

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ARBA 2021 NATIONAL YOUTH MANAGEMENT CONTEST

PURPOSE

To acknowledge excellence of management style by ARBA youth members in the areas of housing & equipment, feeding & animal care, disease control, record keeping, breeding & genetics for the care and production of rabbits and/or cavies.

RULES

- 1 Any ARBA youth member is eligible to compete. Membership must be valid on September 1st. Attendance at the ARBA National Convention is not necessary.
- 2 Applications are to be composed and completed by the contestant.
- 3 Up to seven pages and less than 5500 words, printed on one side only, may be submitted by the applicant.
- 4 Include your name and ARBA membership number at the top of each page of information submitted.
- 5 If entering online, you may upload you application. If entering by mail, you must send your Contest Entry Form and **ONE** copy of your answers!

CATEGORIES

Applications will be judged by ARBA District and on the number of cages/adult animals (division) that a youth member has for housing their animals. Divisions are: Limited Rabbitry (1-20 Holes), Average Rabbitry (21-50 Holes), Unlimited Rabbitry (51+ Holes), and Cavitry (all sizes). <u>Members can enter only ONE division</u>. National winners will be selected in each division. Winners will be announced at the Youth Banquet at the ARBA National Convention. Contestants need not be present to win.

SCORING CRITERIA

Applications will be judged on the following criteria: Cages, Housing & Equipment (50 points); Breeding & Production (50 points); Care, Health & Herd Management (30 points); Record Keeping (20 points); Clarity & Thoroughness of Answers (30 points); Neatness & Appearance of Application (20 points). Applications that do not follow the rules listed above will be assessed a penalty of 10 points per infraction, with the exception of late applications which will be assessed a penalty of 20 points for up to one week late and disqualification for later than one week.

ENTRY PROCEDURES

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ARBA NATIONAL YOUTH MANAGMENT CONTEST APPLICATION

QUESTIONS

- 1 When did you join the ARBA and how many consecutive years have you belonged?
- 2 Name the breed(s) you raise, how many animals you have in each breed and why you raise these breed(s). Also include breed(s) you have raised in the past and why you no longer raise them.
- 3 Describe where your animals are located: barn, outbuilding, yard, garage, basement, house, etc.?
- 4 How do you protect your animals from heat, cold or drafts?
- 5 Describe your cages/coops, list the number, size, materials they are made of and how they are constructed. (i.e., 18 x 24 inch cages made of 12 gauge gaw wire)
- 6 Describe the equipment you use to feed and water your animals.
- 7 What type(s) of feed(s) do you give your animals? Do you give your animals feed supplements? If so, why?
- 8 How do you dispose of the manure and waste your animals generate?
- 9 Describe any other equipment used for the care of the animals in your project.
- 10 Describe everything you consider and do when breeding your animals. Include ages, time of year, system for keeping track of bred animals and provisions for kindling.
- 11 Describe everything you do to care for the mother and young from birth until weaning.
- 12 How many litters with how many total animals did you have born in the previous two calendar years? How many young did you wean?
- 13 Do you track the quality of your offspring to the breeding animals? Explain.
- 14 Describe your culling procedure. What do you do with your surplus animals?
- 15 How many replacement animals have you added in the previous two calendar years? What qualities do you look for in selecting replacements?
- 16 What measures do you take for biosecurity in your rabbitry/cavitry?
- 17 Describe any diseases that have affected your production and explain what you did to control them.
- 18 Explain your system for keeping records and what information is kept on each animal.
- 19 Did your ARBA animal project show a profit or loss last year? Explain.

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ARBA 2021 NATIONAL YOUTH ROYALTY CONTESTS

PURPOSE

To acknowledge excellence among ARBA youth members in attendance at the ARBA National Convention and Show; To allow these members to demonstrate a working knowledge of the rabbit and cavy industry; To explore critical thinking skills, demonstrate personal initiative and provide problem-solving, decision-making and goal-setting activities for these youth members. The ARBA considers the entrants and participants in this Royalty Contest to be our "Best & Brightest" for the continued strength and growth of our organization.

RULES

- 1 Any ARBA youth member is eligible to compete, however, attendance at the National Convention is required.
- 2 Applications are to be composed and completed by the contestant.
- 3 Up to five pages and less than 4500 words, printed on one side only, may be submitted by the applicant.
- 4 Include your name and ARBA membership number at the top of each page of information submitted.
- 5 Enclose a photo of yourself with this application. On the back of the photo write your Royalty age group, name, city, and state. Send photos sized no larger than 3 x 3 inches. This photo is part of your application and will be used in *Domestic Rabbits* and in the *ARBA Yearbook* if you are a Royalty winner. The best photo would be head and shoulders or waist up. You may be with your animal, but remember that you are the center of attention.
- 6 If entering online, you may upload you application and picture. If entering by mail, you must send your Contest Entry Form and **ONE COPY** of your answers as well as your picture!

CATEGORIES

Divisions are: King (Boys, Ages 15-18 years), Queen (Girls, Ages 15-18 years), Duke (Boys, Ages 12-14 years), Duchess (Girls, Ages 12-14 years), Prince (Boys, Ages 9-11 years), Princess (Girls, Ages 9-11 years), Lord (Boys, Ages 5-8 years), Lady (Girls, Ages 5-8 years). Age is determined by the contestant's age on the last day of the National Convention. Winners will be announced at the Youth Banquet at the ARBA National Convention.

CONTEST COMPONENTS

Pre-Convention: Applications will be judged on the following criteria: Size and Scope of Project(30 points); Purpose, Goals & Plans for the Future(30 points); Management(30 points); Achievement(40 points); Leadership(40 points); Clarity & Thoroughness of Answers & Neatness of Application(30 points). Applications that do not follow the rules listed above will be assessed a penalty of 10 points per infraction, except for late applications which will be assessed a penalty of 20 points for up to one week late and disqualification for later than one week.

Saturday, October 23, 2021: Each Royalty contestant will compete in the Individual Contest that is age-appropriate, with the exception of Lord and Lady Contestants. Prince and Princess Contestants will participate in the Showmanship Contest (*please see the individual contest rules for more information*). Contestants will be scored on their ability to handle and evaluate an animal. A sample score sheet is available on the ARBA website Duke, Duchess, King and Queen Candidates will participate in the Judging Contest (*please see the individual contest rules for more information*). Each contestant will judge four classes of four animals. This is a timed event of 7 minutes per class. Placements will be made on special forms provided. The use of the *ARBA Standard of Perfection* at the judging table is encouraged. The use of judging aids or placing markers should be of very minimal size.

Each Royalty contestant will compete in the Breed Identification Contest (*please see the individual contest rules for more information*). Contestant will be required to identify 25 animals, both rabbits and cavies, listing the complete breed name as printed in the *ARBA Standard of Perfection*. They will also identify the showroom variety, whether a 4 class or 6 class breed, and the registration variety of each of the 25 animals. No abbreviations are accepted.

Sunday, October 24, 2021: All contestants will take a Written Examination at the convention. The questions for this test will be taken from the *ARBA Official Guidebook*, the *ARBA Yearbook*, the *ARBA Standard of Perfection*, the *ARBA Domestic Rabbit Guide*, issues of *Domestic Rabbits* from the previous two calendar years, and the ARBA Web Site. Lord and Lady Contestants will be provided help in reading their test. Test answers will be recorded on bubble answer sheets.

Monday, October 25, 2021: Selected contestants will participate in an Oral Interview. By 4:00 p.m. on examination day, the order of oral interviews will be posted. Contestants for interviews should be in proper showroom attire with a show coat, apron with long sleeved shirt or, at minimum, a long sleeve white shirt. If the Youth Committee determines that it is not feasible to interview every contestant in a category, the total points received for the other four components will be used to determine those contestants that will be interviewed.

Tuesday, October 26, 2021: Results will be announced at the Youth Banquet. Results packets will be available from your ARBA Director, or their representative, following the awards presentations.

CONTEST SCORING

Final Scores for the Royalty Contests will be the sum of the scores for each of the five components of the contest. The components are: Application (200 points), Written Examination (200 points), Oral Interview (200 points), Breed Identification (200 points), and the age-appropriate Individual Contest (200 points).

ENTRY PROCEDURES

Entry must be made **online** or on the form provided by the ARBA Youth Department. This form is available from your ARBA District Director, the ARBA office, the ARBA Youth Website, and the ARBA Youth Committee. **NO EMAIL ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.**

ARBA APPLICATION TIPS

PURPOSE

Many of the National Youth Contests of the American Rabbit Breeders Association are application based. This information is presented in order for applicants to take best advantage of the application platform to express themselves and their project. This is not an all-inclusive list of tips, nor is it intended to be a list of requirements, though some of these tips are designed to help applicants understand the specific requirements necessary to create a fair and manageable contest.

BASIC FORMATTING CONVENTIONS

These tips are to help you navigate the requirements of proper formatting. These contests have both a word limit and a page limit. Readability is very important!

- 1 1 Font faces: The two most popular (and readable) fonts are *Times New Roman* and *Arial*. Using one of these will help make the application more readable.
- 2 Font size: Business standards, as well as these contests, use 10-point or 12-point type.
- 3 Page Margins: Margins should be between ½inch and 1½inches, with the most common size being 1 inch.
- 4 Style: The indiscriminate use and overuse of font styles (**bold**, *italic*, underline, etc.) serves to diminish your writing. Some use can be helpful, but be careful only to use it when necessary.
- 5 Questions: Make sure you copy the question above your answer. It reminds the scorers of what you have been asked.

OTHER TIPS FOR A GOOD APPLICATION

- 6 If you are submitting your applications by mail, do not send your applications in report covers or on paper that will not scan well. All applications are scored online, even those submitted by postal mail.
- 7 Make sure you answer the question asked! You can talk about other things as well, but the most common error is not answering the questions asked.
- 8 Pay attention to deadlines. Late applications will sabotage your effort.
- 9 Be clear and concise. Answer the question fully, but do not rely on an unnecessary volume of words to make the point that you want to make just to fill up space for an answer to one of the questions you have been asked, like this tip is doing! Don't use two lines if only one is needed.
- 10 Using good grammar and spelling tells the judge you are serious and careful. Ask a teacher or other adult to help you proofread your application.
- 11 Pictures tell a lot about you and your project. Select them carefully and size them appropriately to tell the story. Include captions so the judges know what they are looking at and why. However, not all answers will lend themselves to being helped by a picture. Concise use of pictures can be just as important as concise use of language.
- 12 Occasionally, the order of questions will change from year to year. Make sure you use the current year's questions. It is always helpful to start with your application from last year, but make sure you properly edit for the current year.
- 13 Put your name and contest on EVERY PAGE of your application.
- 14 Honesty is, as always, the best policy. Be mindful of the fact that scorers, while remaining anonymous, may be able to verify the claims made in your application. You do not want to get caught embellishing your activities or accomplishments.

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ARBA 2021 NATIONAL TEAM BREED IDENTIFICATION CONTEST

PURPOSE

To acknowledge outstanding group critical thinking skills, demonstrate group initiative and provide problem solving and decision making activities in a small group. This is provided through a state represented team identification competition of ARBA recognized breeds at the ARBA National Convention.

ELIGIBILITY

Each state may submit, through their ARBA District Director, as many teams per age division as they wish. Age divisions will be: 5-11 years; 12-14 years; and 15-18 years. The age of a team member is determined as of the last day of the national convention. A team must consist of four members and may have two alternates named. A team must have four members present at the ARBA National Convention. All team members must be ARBA Youth members and current members of an ARBA chartered club in the state they are representing. All team members participating on a state team must be residents of said state. *Contestants not already entered in an individual contest must submit an Entry & Publicity Release Form with this form.*

Your ARBA District Director has the option of submitting a team in each age division consisting of members from within their district. Participants residing in a state without enough participants to form a state team are eligible to participate on a district team. Each district is permitted one district team in each age division.

RULES

- 1 1 Teams consist of four to six members. Selection of the four members who's scores will determine the team score will be made by the Team Coordinator at check-in.
- 2 There is no limit to the number of four to six member teams that may be formed from each state in each age division.
- 3 Team members must participate in their true age group **and may only be a member on one team**.
- 4 All team members must report to the Breed Identification area as a group and go through the contest at the same time.

CONTEST PROCEDURES

- 1 Team members must check into the contest area together. The team will be placed in a supervised area until ALL members of the team have completed the contest. If a team member leaves the contest area without official supervision, they will not be allowed to return to the area and the team will be withdrawn from the competition.
- 2 Each team member will be required to identify 25 animals, both rabbits and cavies, listing the complete breed name as printed in the ARBA Standard of Perfection. They will also identify the showroom variety/classification, whether a 4 class or 6 class breed, and the registration variety of each of the 25 animals. A separate question or animal will act as a tie-breaker. No abbreviations are accepted.
- 3 Team score will be the sum of the four individual member scores on the team. In the event of a tie, the team's tie-breaker scores will be added to the total score.
- 4 Winners will be announced and awards presented at the ARBA Youth Banquet at the National Convention.

ENTRY PROCEDURES

Application must be made on the form provided by the ARBA Youth Department. This form is available from your ARBA District Director, the ARBA office, the ARBA Youth Website, and the ARBA Youth Committee. State organizations are required to inform their ARBA District Director by September 1, 2021 of their intent to participate in this contest. The number of teams from each state must be declared at this time.

Application must be postmarked by September 15, 2021 and should be mailed to your District Director.

The use of the ARBA Standard of Perfection at the judging table is encouraged.
- 3 Judging classes may involve rabbits (including meat classes), cavies, fur and wool.
- 4 Team score will be the sum of the four individual member scores on the team.
- 5 Winners will be announced and awards presented at the ARBA Youth Banquet at the National Convention.
